Joanna Perry re-appointed as Chair of the IFRS® Advisory Council

The Trustees of the IFRS Foundation, responsible for the oversight and governance of the International Accounting Standards Board (the Board), have announced that Joanna Perry has been re-appointed to chair the IFRS Advisory Council for a second term.

The Council comprises over 40 representatives from a wide range of backgrounds and geographic regions. Its role is to advise the IFRS Foundation Trustees and the Board on strategic and technical matters.

Ms Perry has chaired the Advisory Council since April 2014. Her second three-year term as Chair is effective 1 January 2017.
